AN ORDINANCE to amend the Licensing of Vehicles Ordinance, 1914.

[*2/24* May, 1921.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Licensing of Vehicles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1921, and shall be read as one with the Licensing of Vehicles Ordinance, 1914, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance. Short title and construction.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:— Definition of "Trailer."

(a.) The word "Trailer" shall be inserted after the words "Motor Omnibus" in the definition of "Vehicle."


(b.) The following shall be inserted after the definition of "Vehicle":—

"Trailer" means a vehicle (whether coming within the definition of vehicle or not) trailed after or propelled by a motor car, motor cab, motor van, motor lorry or motor omnibus.

Trailers to be licensed.

3. Trailers shall be liable to a licence duty of £10 per annum, and the First Schedule to the Principal Ordinance shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.
