AN ORDINANCE to amend the Former Enemy Aliens Ordinance, 1919.

[8th November, 1921.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Former Enemy Short title. Aliens (Amendment) Ordinance, 1921.

2. Section 2 of the Former Enemy Aliens Ordinance, “Former Enemy 1919, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read Alien.” the following:—

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression “former enemy alien” means an alien who is a subject or citizen of

the German Empire or any component state thereof, or of Austria, Hungary, Bulgaria, or Turkey, or who, having at any time been such subject or citizen, has not changed his allegiance as a result of the recognition of new states or territorial re-arrangements, or been naturalised in any other foreign state or in any British Possession in accordance with the laws thereof and when actually resident therein, and does not retain according to the law of his state of origin the nationality of that state.

Passed in Council this twenty-eighth day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
