AN ORDINANCE to amend the Opium Ordinance, 1912.

*[2<sup>nd</sup> April 1921.]*

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Opium (Amendment) Ordinance, 1921, and shall be read as one with the Opium Ordinance, 1912, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance. Short title and construction.

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:— Prepared opium not to be imported or kept.

3.—(1.) It shall not be lawful to import or be in possession of prepared opium.

(2.) Where any person is charged with being in possession of prepared opium it shall be a sufficient defence for such person to prove that the prepared opium was imported before the first day of January, 1920.
