AN ORDINANCE to amend the law as to gaol delivery.

[6th November, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Gaol Delivery Ordinance, 1920.

Short title.

2. Section eighty-seven of the Criminal Procedure Ordinance which reads as follows:—

Ord. 13.

“87. The Court at the close of every session shall
“discharge all such prisoners as by law shall
“be entitled to be discharged; and the Keeper
“of the Royal Gaol shall on the last day of each
“session of the said Court deliver or cause to
“be delivered to the Court, under a penalty of
“ten pounds sterling in case of his refusal or

“neglect, a list of all persons confined within
“such gaol, together with the date of commit-
“ment and the cause of imprisonment in each
“case and the name of the committing
“authority,”

is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

Gaol delivery.

“87. The Court at the close of every session held in
“Port-of-Spain shall discharge all such prisoners
“as by law shall be entitled to be discharged ;
“and the Keeper of the Royal Gaol shall on the
“last day of each such session deliver or cause
“to be delivered to the Court a list of all persons
“committed for trial before the Court confined
“within such gaol who have not then been tried
“or upon whom sentence has not then been
“passed, together with the date and cause of
“commitment in each case and the name of
“the committing authority.”

Passed in Council this Twenty-second day of October, in
the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and
twenty.
