AN ORDINANCE to give temporary power to prohibit the
exportation of goods.

[31st May, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Exportation of Short title.
goods (prohibition) Ordinance, 1920.

2.—(1.) It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to Power to
time by proclamation published in the *Royal Gazette* to prohibit
prohibit the exportation of any goods or merchandize exportation
of any description whatsoever. of goods.

(2.) If any goods or merchandize so prohibited are
exported or brought to any quay or other place to be
shipped for exportation from the Colony or to be carried
coastwise or are water-borne to be so exported or carried,
they shall be forfeited and the exporter or his agent or
the shipper of any such goods or merchandize shall be
liable to a penalty of one hundred pounds.

(3.) Any such proclamation may prohibit exportation until the revocation thereof or during such period as may be specified therein.

(4.) In any such proclamation it shall be lawful for the Governor to prohibit the exportation of any such goods or merchandize either generally or to any country or countries to the exclusion of other countries or to any places or ports in any country to the exclusion of other places or ports therein, with the intent that it shall be competent for the Governor by any such proclamation to prevent and prohibit the export of such goods or merchandize to any such country or place without thereby prohibiting the exportation to all other countries and places at the same time.

(5.) This section shall have effect as if it formed part of the Customs Ordinance.

Duration of Ordinance.

3. This Ordinance shall continue in force until the eleventh day of January, 1923, and no longer.
