AN ORDINANCE to amend the Roads Ordinance, 1917.

[17th December, 1919.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Roads Ordinance Short title.
(No. 2), 1919.

2. Section eleven of the Roads Ordinance, 1917, which Amendment of section 11 of Ordinance No. 28--1917.
reads as follows:—

“11. Whenever any public road shall—

“*(a.)* be obstructed or encroached upon by any
“fence, gate, ditch, trench or enclosure, or
“overhung or bordered upon by any tree or
“brushwood; or

“(b.) be overhung by any tree or the branches
“thereof or any brushwood ;

“it shall be lawful for the Director, or the Warden,
“or any person authorised by them or either of them,
“to cause such fence, gate, ditch, trench, enclosure,
“tree or brushwood to be removed or filled in at the
“expense of the person who shall cause such
“obstruction or encroachment, or at the expense of
“the owner or tenant of any lands whereon any trees
“or brushwood obstructing or overhanging such road
“shall be growing and standing.”

is hereby amended so as to read as follows:—

“11. Whenever any public road shall—

“(a.) be obstructed or encroached upon by any
“fence, gate, tree, brushwood, ditch, trench,
“enclosure, or thing ;

“(b.) be overhung by any tree, or by a branch of
“any tree, or by any brushwood ; or

“(c.) be rendered unsafe for persons using the
“road by the presence on adjoining land of
“a tree which is dry, barked, dead, or dying,
“or likely to fall

“it shall be lawful for the Director, or the Warden, or
“any person authorised by them or either of them, to
“cause such fence, gate, ditch, trench, enclosure, tree,
“branch, brushwood, or thing to be removed, lopped,
“or filled in, as the case may require.”

Amendment
of section 12
of Ordinance
28-1917.

3. In section twelve of the Roads Ordinance, 1917,
the words:—

“from the owner or tenant of any lands whereon
“any such trees or brushwood shall be growing and
“standing”

are hereby amended so as to read as follows:—

“from the owner or tenant of any lands whereon any
“such trees or brushwood shall be growing, standing,
“or lying.”
