AN ORDINANCE to amend the Customs Ordinance, No. 178, with regard to the importation of dyes and dye-stuffs.

[17th December, 1919.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs (amendment) Ordinance, 1919.

Importation of
dyes and
dye-stuffs.

2. Section eleven of the Customs Ordinance (No. 178) is hereby amended by adding under the heading "Goods prohibited to be imported except subject to the restrictions on importation herein contained" the following:—

Dyes and dye-stuffs as hereinafter specified, not the produce or manufacture of any part of the British Empire, except under the licence of the Governor:

All derivatives of coal tar generally known as intermediate products capable of being used or adapted for use as dye-stuffs, or of being modified or further manufactured into dye-stuffs.

All direct cotton colours, all union colours, all acid colours, all chrome and mordant colours, all alizarine colours, all basic colours, all sulphide colours, all vat colours (including synthetic indigo), all oil, spirit, and wax colours, all lake colours, and any other synthetic colours, dyes, stains, colour acids, colour lakes, leuco acids, leuco bases, whether in paste, powder, solution or any other form.

Passed in Council this Fifth day of December, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

Section 21 ...	Section 21. The provision for imprisonment in default of payment of a fine is omitted as unnecessary. <i>See</i> Section 65 of Ordinance 9 of 1918.
" 22 ...	Omitted. This Section was copied from a Grenada Ordinance and is unsuitable to Trinidad. None of the "Documents necessitated by any steps taken under this Ordinance" are liable to stamp duty or stamp fees. As regards legal proceedings, public officers are exempted from fees in Magistrates Courts. (Section 15 of Ordinance 9-1918.) In the Supreme Court the practice is that the usual fees are paid.
" 23 ...	Section 22, as amended by Ordinance 5 of 1917. The last two lines of (f) have been made into a separate paragraph.
" 24 ...	Section 23. The reference to regulations is omitted as unnecessary. <i>See</i> Section 11 of Ordinance 34-1912.
" 25 ...	Omitted. Section 24 of the Bill repeals the existing Ordinances. A saving clause is unnecessary. <i>See</i> Section 20 of Ordinance 34-1912.
