AN ORDINANCE to make provision for determining the date of the termination of the present war, and for purposes connected therewith.

[18th December, 1919.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Termination of the Present War (Definition) Ordinance, 1919.

Power to

2.—(1.) The Governor in Executive Council may by Proclamation published in the *Royal Gazette* declare what date is to be treated as the date of the termination of the present war, and the present war shall be treated as having continued to, and as having ended on that date for the purposes of any provision in any Ordinance, Proclamation,

order, or regulation, and, except where the context otherwise requires, of any provision in any contract, deed, or other instrument referring, expressly or impliedly, and in whatever form of words, to the present war or the present hostilities.

(2.) The Governor in Executive Council may also similarly declare what date is to be treated as the date of the termination of the war between His Majesty and any particular State.
