AN ORDINANCE to amend the Government Currency
Notes Ordinance, No. 244.

[26th March, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Government Currency Notes (Amendment) Ordinance, 1920.

Amendment of
(4) of s. 7 of
Ord. 244.

2.—(1.) Sub-section (4) of section seven of the Government Currency Notes Ordinance (No. 244) is hereby amended by striking out the words "one half" in the last line thereof and substituting therefor the words "one third."

Duration of
this section.

(2.) This section shall remain in force for the period of three years from the date of the commencement of this Ordinance and no longer.

3. All acts and things done before the commencement of this Ordinance by which the coin portion of the Note Guarantee Fund, which by proclamation No. 35 of 1907 was fixed at one-half, has been reduced to one-third, are hereby declared to have been and to be good and valid in law to all intents and purposes whatsoever in all respects as if such acts and things had been duly done after the commencement of this Ordinance.
