AN ORDINANCE to amend the Industrial Training Ordinance, 1911.

[12th December, 1918.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Industrial Training (Amendment) Ordinance, 1918.

Amendment of
Section 2 of
Principal
Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Industrial Training Ordinance, 1911, is hereby amended as follows:

(i.) The following shall be read after the word "himself" in the seventeenth line of the first paragraph:

Provided that it shall be lawful in any case in which the Board may allow it, for such father, mother or other person as aforesaid in the first instance to place such boy as a probationary

apprentice, on such conditions as may be mutually agreed upon between the parties with the assent of the Board, in any of such trades for a period of not less than three months, such period to count under the contract of apprenticeship if entered into.

(ii.) In lieu of the words "at least twice" in the second paragraph shall be read the word "once."

(iii.) The following shall be read after the second paragraph:

Any master who shall take on any probationary apprentice without the previous knowledge and consent of the Board shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and on summary conviction thereof before a Magistrate shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

3. In lieu of the words "Stipendiary Justice of the Peace" wherever the same occur in the Ordinance No. 5 of 1911 shall be read the word "Magistrate." ^{"Magistrate."}
