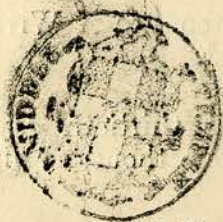

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Maintenance of Wives  
and Children Ordinance, (No. 4).

[7th December, 1917.]

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Maintenance Short Title.  
of Wives and Children (Amendment) Ordinance, 1917.

2.—(1.) A Magistrate may upon application by or on  
behalf of the person in whose favour or against whom an Magistrate  
may vary or  
discharge  
order.  
order is made under the Maintenance of Wives and Children  
Ordinance (No. 4), and upon cause shown upon fresh  
evidence to the satisfaction of the Court, at any time alter,  
vary or discharge any such order, whether made before or  
after the commencement of this Ordinance, and may upon  
any such application from time to time increase or diminish  
the amount of the weekly or monthly payment therein  
ordered to be made.



(2.) Payment of any amount so ordered to be made may be enforced and recovered in the same manner as if it had been mentioned in the original order of maintenance.

(3.) If any wife upon whose application an order shall have been made under the Maintenance of Wives and Children Ordinance (No. 4) shall commit an act of adultery, such order shall upon proof thereof be discharged.

Repeal.

3. Section 5 of the Maintenance of Wives and Children Ordinance is hereby repealed.
