AN ORDINANCE to amend the Beer Duties Ordinance,
(No. 251.)

[8th June, 1917.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Beer Duties Short Title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1917.

2. Notwithstanding anything in the Beer Duties Ordinance (No. 251) contained, no duty shall be paid on beer brewed in the Colony delivered for the use of His Majesty's Naval Forces during the continuation of the present war ; Beer for His Majesty's Naval Forces exempt from duty.

Provided that in respect of each such delivery a certificate signed by the officer for the time being in command of such Forces in the Colony is produced to the Receiver-General to the effect that such Beer is for the use of His Majesty's Naval Forces.
