AN ORDINANCE to amend the Customs Ordinance
(No. 178) and the Customs Duties Ordinance, 1913.

[8th June, 1917.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs (Amend- Short Title.
ment) Ordinance, 1917.

2. Notwithstanding anything in the Customs Ordinance Customable
(No. 178) or the Customs Duties Ordinance, 1913, contained, goods for His
