AN ORDINANCE to amend the Petroleum Spirit and
Petroleum Oil Excise Ordinance, 1914.

[30th May, 1917.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Petroleum Spirit Short Title.
and Petroleum Oil Excise (Amendment) Ordinance, 1917.

2. (1.)—Notwithstanding anything in the Petroleum Petroleum
spirit and oil
for H.M. Naval
Forces exempt
from duty.
Spirit and Petroleum Oil Excise Ordinance, 1914, contained,
no duty shall be paid by a manufacturer on any Petroleum
Spirit or Petroleum Oil manufactured and delivered by
him in the Colony for the use of His Majesty's Naval
Forces; Provided that in respect of each such delivery a
certificate signed by the Officer for the time being in
command of such Forces in the Colony is produced to the



Receiver-General to the effect that such Petroleum Spirit or Petroleum Oil is for the use of His Majesty's Naval Forces.

(2.) The provisions of this section shall apply to Petroleum Spirit or Petroleum Oil of which delivery has been made previously to the commencement of this Ordinance.
