AN ORDINANCE to amend the Customs Ordinances during the present war.

[7th July, 1916.]

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short Title.  
Construction.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs (War Powers) (Amendment) Ordinance, (No. 2) 1916, and shall be read as one with the Customs Ordinance, (No. 178) and the Customs (War Powers) Ordinances, 1915 and 1916.

Power to deal  
with in transit  
goods.

2. For the purposes of the Customs Ordinances and of the provisions of any Order of His Majesty in Council dealing with the exportation of articles from the Colony, goods in transit in British ships, or in ships belonging to any power in alliance with His Majesty's Government during the present war may, subject to such instructions as may be given by the Governor either in a particular case or generally, be treated and dealt with as if the same had been landed for transshipment; and the provisions of the said Ordinances and Orders in Council shall apply accordingly.

Passed in Council this Thirtieth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.
