ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title
and
Commence-
ment

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation
Ordinance, 1948, and shall be deemed to have come into force
on the 1st January, 1948.

2. A sum not exceeding forty-five million three hundred and fifty-one thousand four hundred and eighty-four dollars shall be, and the same hereby is, charged upon the revenue and other funds of the Colony for the service of the year ending on the 31st December, 1948; and the same shall be expended in the manner hereinafter described and in conformity with the Schedules to this Ordinance.

3. The Accountant General may, on the warrant of the Governor, pay out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1948, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of thirty-eight million two hundred and sixty-four thousand and twenty-eight dollars set forth in the First Schedule to this Ordinance.

4. The Accountant General may, on the warrant of the Governor, pay out of the revenue of the Trinidad Government Railway and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1948, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of four million and eighty-four thousand one hundred and forty dollars set forth in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance: Provided that any balance of such sum unissued at the end of December of that year may be utilised before the accounts of the said period are closed for the discharge of any liability incurred during the said period.

5. The Accountant General may, on the warrant of the Governor, pay out of the revenue of the Port Services (formerly Harbours, Wharves and Slipway) Department and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1948, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of three million and three thousand three hundred and sixteen dollars set forth in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance: Provided that any balance of such sum unissued at the end of December of that year may be utilised before the accounts of the said period are closed for the discharge of any liability incurred during the said period.
