Navy Club Ordinance, 1944.Commence-

E NACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the British and Allied
Merchant Navy Club (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall
be read as one with the British and Allied Merchant Navy
Club Ordinance, 1944, hereinafter referred to as the Principal
Ordinance.

2. (1) The organisation formerly known as the British and Allied Merchant Navy Club which was established and functioned at St. Ann's, Port-of-Spain, in premises described in the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance, is hereby authorised to function in the premises described in the Schedule to this Ordinance under the description of the Merchant Navy Club and shall continue to be controlled, managed and maintained by the Board.

(2) The Schedule to this Ordinance may be amended or varied by an order of the Governor in Council made at the request of the Board, and such amendment or variation when notified in the *Royal Gazette* shall have effect as if enacted by an amendment to this Ordinance.

(3) The Board shall henceforth be designated for all purposes as the Board of Management of the Merchant Navy Club.

3. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed.

4. Subsection (1) of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following :—

“The Club shall continue to be maintained for the provision of the usual amenities of a social club for the comfort, recreation and welfare of seamen who are members of the Club during their stay in the Colony.”

5. Subsection (1) of section 15 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting the words “in which the Club is from time to time authorised to function” for the words “described in the Schedule hereto.”

That piece of land situate at Wrightson Road in the City of Port-of-Spain in the County of St. George and bounded as follows :—
