Ch. 26. No. 2.Commence-

Enactment

**E**NACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with  
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title

**1.** This Ordinance may be cited as the Petroleum (Amend-  
ment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the  
Ch. 26, No. 2 Petroleum Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal  
Ordinance,

2. The Governor in Council may, for the protection of persons and property against fire or explosion, make regulations under the Principal Ordinance determining the restrictions to be imposed upon persons when in close proximity to petroleum stored or being used for any purpose at any place.

Power to make regulations under Principal Ordinance for protection against fire or explosion.

Section 16 of  
Principal  
Ordinance  
amended

4. Subsection (1) of section 16 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting the following paragraph for paragraph (b) thereof :—

"(b) shall have made a contribution under the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Ordinance, or under any similar enactment in the United Kingdom or in any part of His Majesty's dominions, or in any British Protectorate or Protected State, or in any territory in respect of which any of His Majesty's Governments have accepted a Mandate on behalf of the League of Nations or of the United Nations or otherwise, or to such fund or scheme as the Governor may approve."
