AN ORDINANCE for the Incorporation of certain persons as
Trustees of the West Indian United Baptist Sacred Order.

[19th November, 1949]

Commence-

WHEREAS there has been established in the Colony an Association known as the West Indian United Baptist Sacred Order (hereinafter called "the Order") which is representative of the Spiritual Baptists in the Colony: Preamble

And Whereas Clifford Cato of Monteil Trace, Fyzabad Junction; Leo Sandiford of 9, St. James Street, San Fernando; Cyril Williams of 42, Marriott Street, San Fernando; Harvey Glaud of Delhi Road Settlement, Fyzabad; Christopher Meyers of Marabella; Phillip Alexis of Baptist Street; Farrell Thomas of Bedoo Street, Gasparillo and Roderick Nicholas of Charles Street, Gasparillo have been appointed Trustees of the Order:

And Whereas it is expedient that the Trustees for the time being of the Order should be incorporated and should have power to hold lands and other property in trust for the Order:

Enactment

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the West Indian United Baptist Sacred Order (Incorporation) Ordinance, 1949.

Incorporation of Trustees.

2. The said Clifford Cato, Leo Sandiford, Cyril Williams, Harvey Glaud, Christopher Meyers, Phillip Alexis, Farrell Thomas and Roderick Nicholas and their successors in office as such Trustees as aforesaid shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The West Indian United Baptist Sacred Order" (hereinafter called "The Incorporated Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Colony and shall have and use a common seal, which may from time to time be changed by the Order.

Trustees may acquire property

3. The Incorporated Trustees shall, subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Order, have full power to acquire for the Order by purchase, exchange, demise, gift, bequest or otherwise, all lands or other property of what nature or kind soever in perpetuity or for a life or lives or for any term of years, and also any money, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever; and subject to such rules and regulations and control as aforesaid to take, hold and enjoy the same, and subject also to the performance of any trust upon which the said lands or other property, money, securities for money, goods or chattels may have been acquired.

4. It shall be lawful for the incorporated Trustees, subject to such rules, regulations and control as aforesaid, from time to time by deed under their seal to sell or demise, grant, convey, mortgage, exchange or otherwise dispose of and deal with any lands or other property vested or which may hereafter be vested in them.

Trustees may dispose of property.

5. The Incorporated Trustees shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on them and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the Incorporated Trustees may be served by leaving the same at, or sending the same by registered post to, the address so registered.

Service of documents on the Trustees.

6. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Ordinance and those claiming by, through, from or under them.

Saving of Crown and other rights.

Passed in Council this fourth day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.
