AN ORDINANCE to amend the United States Bases
(Temporary Provisions) Ordinance, 1941.

Enactment

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the United States Bases
(Temporary Provisions) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and
shall be read as one with the United States Bases (Temporary
Provisions) Ordinance, 1941.

2. (1) No person other than a person or authority permitted to import material, equipment, supplies or goods into the Colony free of import duties of Customs in pursuance of the provisions of Article XIV of the Agreement shall purchase, acquire or receive from any person or authority so permitted any material, equipment, supplies or goods so imported unless there has been issued to him by a person authorised by the Governor to issue permits under this section a permit in writing to do so.

Restriction on purchasing, &c., of material, &c. admitted free of duty in pursuance of the provisions of the Bases Agreement

(2) Every person, other than a person or authority so permitted, who purchases, acquires or receives from any such person or authority any such materials, equipment, supplies or goods so imported shall be deemed to be the importer thereof and such material, equipment, supplies or goods shall be deemed to have been imported into the Colony on the date of such purchase, acquisition or receiving, as the case may be, and, if not previously entered, shall be entered forthwith for use in the Colony or for exportation, as the case may be, by the person purchasing, acquiring or receiving the same.

(3) Any person other than a person or authority so permitted who —

(a) not being authorised under a permit issued under this section purchases, acquires, or receives any material, equipment, supplies or goods which has or have been so imported and in respect of which no permit under this section has been issued ; or

(b) having purchased, acquired or received any material, equipment, supplies or goods so imported which has or have not been previously entered, fails to have the same forthwith entered for use in the Colony or for exportation, as the case may be,

shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars or to imprisonment for six months, and such material, equipment, supplies or goods shall be forfeited and shall be dealt with in the manner provided for in the Customs Ordinance.

(4) The Governor may from time to time authorise any person to issue permits for the purposes of this section and such permits shall be in such form as such person may determine.

Ch. 32. No. 2. (5) In this section, "entered" and "importer" have the same meanings as in the Customs Ordinance.
