AN ORDINANCE to amend the Wild Animals and Birds
(Protection) Ordinance, Ch. 25. No. 7.

[31st January, 1946.]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Wild Animals and
Birds (Protection) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1946, and shall
be read as one with the Wild Animals and Birds (Protection)
Ordinance hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by repealing section 20 thereof and replacing the same by the following:—

“Protection
of deer in
Tobago.

20. (1) It shall not be lawful for any person to hunt, kill, wound or take any deer in Tobago except during such time as the Governor may by proclamation declare.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred and forty dollars and any deer or part of a deer in respect of which a conviction for an offence under this section takes place shall be forfeited to the Crown and shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court in which the conviction takes place shall direct.”

Passed in Council this ninth day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-six.
