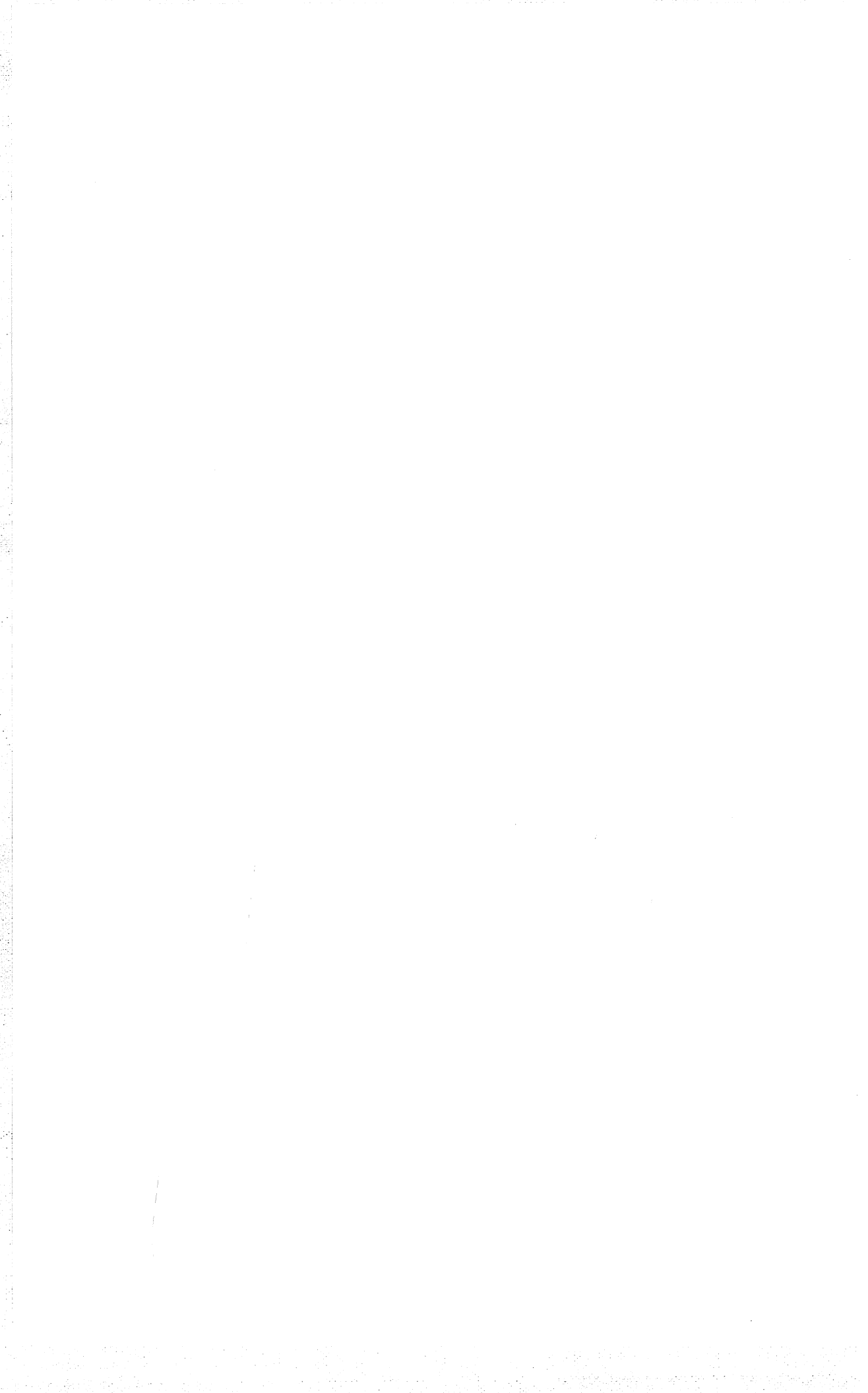
**E**NACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Merchant Shipping Ordinance as amended by the Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Ordinance, 1946.

2. Section 2 of the Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Ordinance, 1946 is hereby amended by substituting the following definition for the definition of "intercolonial ship":—

"intercolonial ship" includes a ship employed in trading or going between the Island of Trinidad and the Island of Tobago, or between some place or places in the Colony and some place or places between the equator and latitude 28° N. and east of longitude 90° W. and west of longitude 50° W., but does not include a coastal ship or a ship employed in trading within the Waters of the Gulf of Paria.'

3. Section 3 of the Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Ordinance, 1946 is hereby amended—

(a) by omitting the figure "(1)" from the first line thereof;

(b) by repealing subsection (2).

4. This Ordinance and the Merchant Shipping (Examinations for Certificates of Competency) (Amendment) Rules, 1947 shall be deemed to have been in force from the 27th January, 1947.
