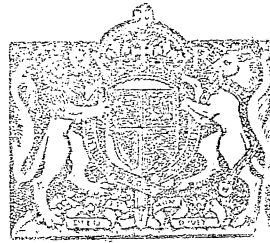

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Assurance Companies  
Ordinance, 1943.

[27th April, 1944.]

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Assurance Companies (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, and shall be read and construed as one with the Assurance Companies Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Section 3 of

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding a new subsection thereto as follows:—

“(4) Save as otherwise expressly provided by this Ordinance, nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to assurance business of any class other than one of the classes specified in this section, and a policy shall not be deemed to be a policy of fire insurance by reason only that loss by fire is one of the various risks covered by the policy.”

3. Section 37 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein between subsections (2) and (3) a new subsection (2A) as follows:—

“(2A) An assurance company in whose favour an order has been made under this section shall furnish annually to the Colonial Secretary, on or before such date as the Governor in Council may generally or specially require, such proof as the Governor in Council may generally or specially require that the circumstances mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1) continue to apply to the company. Any such general requirement may be by rules made under section 41. If any assurance company fails to comply with any requirement under this section, the circumstances mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1) shall be deemed to have ceased to apply to the company.”

Section 39 of  
the Principal

amended.

4. Section 39 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein immediately after the word “prescribe” the words “or as may be allowed by the Governor in Council in any special case.”
