AN ORDINANCE to make special provisions for the trial of persons charged with causing a nuisance of a public nature.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Nuisance (Special Provisions) Ordinance, 1945.

Summary
trial.

2. Any person, who causes a nuisance to the public, and any person, who at any time takes any part in causing such a nuisance, and any person occupying or having control over any house, yard or premises of whatsoever nature, who permits such nuisance in such house, yard or premises, shall, without prejudice to anything contained in any other law, be liable to be tried summarily and on conviction to a fine of two hundred and forty dollars or in default of payment to imprisonment for six months.
