AN ORDINANCE to amend the Firearms and Ammunition Ordinance, Ch. 30. No. 5.

[22nd November, 1945.]

Commencement,

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the Enactment. advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Short title. Firearms and Ammunition (Amendment) Ordinance, 1945, and shall be read as Ch. 30. No. 5 one with the Firearms and Ammunition Ordinance hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance,

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by renumbering the same as section 3 subsection (1) and adding thereto the following:—

“Provided also that any employee may use or carry any firearm belonging to and duly licensed by his employer when actually engaged on the business of his employer for the protection of the employer or his employer’s property.”
and by inserting thereafter the following subsections (2) and (3):—

“(2) It shall not be lawful for any such person or employee as described in the last two provisos of the foregoing subsection to use or carry any firearm as therein provided unless the said person or employee shall first obtain from the Officer of Police in charge of the division in which the applicant resides a certificate of his fitness to use a firearm; such certificate shall remain in force until cancelled but may be cancelled at any time by the Officer of Police in charge of the division aforesaid if he thinks fit.

(3) Any person aggrieved by a refusal to grant, or the cancellation of, a certificate may appeal to the Commissioner of Police whose decision shall be final”.
