AN ORDINANCE to amend the Mines, Borings and  
Quarries Ordinance, Ch. 26. No. 4.

[18th November, 1943.]

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Mines, Borings  
and Quarries (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943, and shall be  
read and construed as one with the Mines, Borings and  
Quarries Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal  
Ordinance.

Section 18 of  
the Principal

amended,

2. Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting subsection (1) thereof and substituting therefor the following :—

“ (1) On or before the 21st of January in every year, the owner, agent, or manager of every mine, boring or quarry shall send to the Inspector a correct return specifying, with respect to the year ending on the preceding 31st of December—

- (a) the amount of slate, stone, coprolites, asphalt, crude petroleum, or other minerals gotten ;
- (b) the average number of persons in or about the mine, boring or quarry employed by him or by persons under contract with him ;
- (c) the amount of crude petroleum and petroleum products consumed and the amount of crude petroleum and petroleum products sold for local consumption ;
- (d) the length of main pipelines ;
- (e) the capacity of storage tanks ;
- (f) the capacity of refineries ;
- (g) such other statistical information as the Inspector may from time to time require :

Provided that the owner, agent, or manager may appeal to the Governor against any requirement that other statistical information be included in the return in accordance with paragraph (g) of this subsection on the ground that the information is not obtainable in the course of operations which are normal in the industry and that he ought not fairly to be asked to supply it, and the Governor may thereupon confirm, modify or cancel the requirement, and his decision shall be final ”.
