AN ORDINANCE to amend the Roads Ordinance,
Ch 16. No. 1.

[25th November, 1943.]

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Roads Short title
and construc-
tion. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943, and shall be read and
construed as one with the Roads Ordinance, hereinafter Ch. 16. No. 1.
referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Section 42 of
the Principal
Ordinance
repealed and
replaced.

2. (1) Section 42 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following section :—

“Pensions and gratuities.” 42. (1) In this section—
“office to which this section relates” means any of the following offices under a Local Board, namely, Secretary, Road Officer and Assistant Road Officer ;

Ch. 9. No. 6 “the Pension Laws” means the Pensions Ordinance and the regulations thereunder, and any Ordinance or regulations from time to time amending or replacing them.

(2) The Pension Laws shall have effect *mutatis mutandis* in relation to officers who have held offices to which this section relates as though those offices were pensionable offices within the meaning of the Pension Laws :
Provided that—

(a) sections 9A and 9B and subsection (1) of section 15 of the Pensions Ordinance and Part II of the Pensions Regulations, 1938, and any similar provision of any other Pension Laws, shall not apply ;

(b) subsection (4) of section 9 and section 18 of the Pensions Ordinance and regulation 12 of the Pensions Regulations, 1938, and any similar provisions of any other Pension Laws, shall apply *mutatis mutandis* in the case of the holders of all offices under a Local Board (not being offices the holders of which are ordinarily required to be depositors under any Provident Fund Ordinance) who hold any office under a Local Board, whether or not they are offices to which this section relates, and all offices under Local Boards which are neither offices to which this section relates nor offices the holders of which are ordinarily required to be

depositors under any Provident Fund Ordinance shall be deemed for the purposes of those provisions to be non-pensionable offices.

(3) Pensions, gratuities and other allowances awarded by virtue of this section shall be paid from the public funds of the Colony."

(2) This section shall not have effect in any case in which pension privileges, gratuities or other allowances fall to be awarded or have been awarded in the case of any officers by reason of the fact that they have ceased to be in the public service before the commencement of this Ordinance: Provided that sections 12, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22 and 23 of the Pensions Ordinance shall apply in all such cases.
