AN ORDINANCE to make special provision for the grant
of a pension to Mr. J. A. Fleming.

[4th April, 1940.]

Commencement.

WHEREAS Mr. J. A. Fleming was in the service of the
Colony from the 18th October, 1897, to the
3rd October, 1904, in a non-pensionable office ;

And Whereas on the 4th October, 1904, he was seconded
for service with the Water Authority and Sewerage Board
(which subsequently became vested in the Town Board of
Port-of-Spain) on the understanding that he would be
re-absorbed into the Government Service when a suitable
opportunity occurred ;

And Whereas Mr. Fleming continued in the service of the Town Board of Port-of-Spain and of the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Port-of-Spain (hereinafter referred to as the Corporation) until he retired on the 31st March, 1937, after reaching the age limit ;

And Whereas it is deemed fair and expedient under the special circumstances of this case that Government should contribute towards the pension and gratuity granted to Mr. Fleming as if he had held a pensionable office in Government service and as if the Corporation were a scheduled government ;

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Ordinance may be cited as the Joseph A. Fleming Pension Ordinance, 1940.

Definition. **2.** In this Ordinance—

Cap. 224. “Corporation” has the same meaning as in the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance.

Pension to be granted to Mr. J. A. Fleming. **3.** Anything to the contrary notwithstanding in the Pensions Ordinance, 1934, as amended by the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and in the Pensions Regulations, 1934, it shall be lawful to grant a pension to Mr. J. A. Fleming in respect of his period of service with the Government of the Colony as if such service had been in a pensionable office and as if his subsequent period of service with the Corporation had been pensionable service with a government included in the First Schedule to the Pensions Ordinance, 1934.
