AN ORDINANCE to repeal the Habitual Criminals
Ordinance, Cap. 22.

[31st December, 1940.]

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Habitual
Criminals (Repeal) Ordinance, 1940, and shall come into
force on such day as may be fixed by the Governor
by Proclamation.

Short title and
commencement.

Repeal

2. The Habitual Criminals Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance) is hereby repealed.

Provisions as
to existing
sentences of
preventive
detention, &c.

3. Upon the coming into force of this Ordinance, all sentences of preventive detention ordered under the Principal Ordinance and all terms and conditions on which any licences have been granted under the Principal Ordinance shall cease to have effect.
