United States Counsel

AN ORDINANCE to confer a limited right of audience in the Courts of the Colony on United States Counsel.

[6th November, 1941.]

Commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the United States Short title.
Counsel Ordinance, 1941.

2. In this Ordinance—

“United States Counsel” means United States Interpretation.
Counsel authorised to practise before any of the Federal or State Courts of the United States of America who are in the service of the Government of the United States of America and who have been appointed by or on behalf of the Government of the United States of America to exercise the rights conferred by this Ordinance.

“United States Forces” means the Naval and Military Forces of the United States of America.

3. In cases in which a member of the United States Right of
Forces shall be a party to a civil or criminal proceeding in audience of
any Court in the Colony by reason of some alleged act or authorised
omission arising, or alleged to have arisen, out of or in the United States
course of his official duty, authorised United States Counsel Counsel.
shall, notwithstanding that they are not barristers or solicitors of the Supreme Court, have the right of audience and the right to do, in relation to the proceeding, all such things as might properly be done by a barrister or solicitor of the Supreme Court.
