Currency Notes (Barbados and British Guiana).

AN ORDINANCE to declare certain currency notes which are legal tender in Barbados and British Guiana to be legal tender in the Colony and to modify the application of section 6 of the Government Currency Notes Ordinance, Ch. 35. No. 2.

[1st July, 1941.]

Commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Currency Notes Short title.
(Barbados and British Guiana) Ordinance, 1941.
2. In this Ordinance—
 - “Barbados currency note” means a note of any Interpretation.
denomination which by virtue of an Act of the legislature of Barbados known as the Government Currency Notes (Barbados) Act, 1937, is legal tender in Barbados ;
 - “British Guiana currency note” means a note of any denomination which by virtue of an Ordinance of the legislature of British Guiana known as the Government Currency Notes Ordinance, 1937, is legal tender in British Guiana.
3. Any note which, at the time of tender, is a Barbados Barbados and British Guiana currency notes to be legal tender in the Colony.
currency note or a British Guiana currency note shall be legal tender in this Colony to the full amount expressed in such note and shall be taken as a tender to such amount for all sums and on all occasions on which any tender of money can legally be made.
4. Section 6 of the Government Currency Notes Modification of the application of Section 6 of the Government Currency Notes Ordinance. Ch. 35. No. 2.
Ordinance shall not apply in relation to the circulation in Barbados or British Guiana of currency notes issued, or deemed to have been issued, under that Ordinance.
