AN ORDINANCE to give Legislative sanction to certain expenditure from the funds of the Port-of-Spain Corporation for the purposes of Group Life Insurance for the benefit of its employees.

WHEREAS expenditure of the funds or moneys of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Port-of-Spain (hereinafter referred to as the Corporation) is limited to certain purposes only as defined by Section 121 of the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance, Cap. 224 :

AND WHEREAS expenditure of the sum hereinafter mentioned, which has been expended by the Corporation for the purpose of Group Insurance on the lives of certain of its employees, is not authorized by the said Section 121, and it is expedient that such expenditure should be given Legislative sanction :

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Port-of-Spain Corporation (Validation of Insurance Expenditure) Ordinance, 1937.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 121 of the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance, the expenditure by the Corporation of the sum of Nine thousand one hundred and thirty-two Dollars and four cents paid to the Confederation Life Association in two instalments namely, Four thousand four hundred and ninety-two Dollars and fifty cents on the first day of November, 1936, and Four thousand six hundred and thirty-nine Dollars and fifty-four cents on the first day of May, 1937, by way of premiums on a Group Life Insurance Policy on the lives of certain employees of the Corporation, is hereby validated and shall be deemed to have been lawfully incurred for the purposes for which such premiums were paid: Provided that nothing herein shall be construed as authorizing the payment by the Corporation of any further sums for the like purpose.

Passed in Council this twenty-eighth day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.
