AN ORDINANCE to regulate the Emoluments attached  
to the office of the Governor.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Governor's Short title.  
Emoluments Ordinance, 1937.

2. The emoluments attached to the office of Governor Emoluments  
of the Colony shall consist of— of the  
Governor.

(a) Salary at the rate of sixteen thousand eight  
hundred dollars per annum, and

(b) Duty allowance at the rate of seven thousand  
two hundred dollars per annum.

3.—(1) An officer appointed to be Governor of the Commence-  
ment of salary  
of Governor  
before assump-  
tion of office,  
Colony shall receive salary at one-half the rate specified  
in paragraph (a) of section 2 of this Ordinance from the  
date on which he embarks to assume the Government,  
whether the port of embarkation be in England or elsewhere.

(2) If, however, a Governor continues in the tenure of his office until the arrival of his successor, the latter officer shall not be entitled to any portion of the salary until he has assumed the duties of his office.

(3) If the office of Governor is vacated after the incoming Governor has embarked to assume the Government, he shall receive salary at one-half the rate specified in paragraph (a) of section 2 of this Ordinance from the date of such vacancy.

4. The Governor shall, when full pay leave is granted to him by the Secretary of State, receive salary at the rate specified in paragraph (a) of section 2 of this Ordinance during any period or periods of absence. Such leave shall not exceed six weeks for each period of twelve consecutive months resident service, but where such leave is spent in a place other than the Colony the Governor shall in addition be allowed the time necessarily taken on the journey to and from such place and salary at the rate fixed by this section shall be paid for the time allowed on each journey from and including the day of embarkation.

5.—(1) The Governor shall, when visiting any neighbouring Colony or State, receive salary at the rate specified in paragraph (a) of section 2 of this Ordinance during the period occupied in such visit including the time necessarily taken on the journey to and from such Colony or State.

(2) The period occupied in such visit shall not be taken into consideration in estimating any period of full pay leave which may be granted to the Governor under section 4 of this Ordinance.

Salary of  
Governor  
during period  
of incapacity  
or on half pay  
leave.

6. If the Governor—

(a) be incapacitated from performing the duties of his office ; or

(b) be on leave other than as provided for in section 4 of this Ordinance,

and another officer be sworn to administer the Government, then the Governor shall, during such incapacity or leave, receive salary at one-half the rate specified in paragraph (a) of section 2 of this Ordinance.

7.—(1) In the circumstances provided for by sections 3 and 6 of this Ordinance, during the period the Governor receives one-half the rate of salary, the Officer administering the Government shall receive the remaining half of the salary, and the whole duty allowance specified in paragraph (b) of section 2 of this Ordinance, and, if he be the holder of any other office, one-half the salary of such office. Emoluments of Acting Governor.

(2) In the circumstances provided for by sections 4 and 5 of this Ordinance, during the period the Governor receives full salary, the Officer administering the Government, or the Governor's Deputy, as the case may be, shall receive the duty allowance specified in paragraph (b) of section 2 of this Ordinance, in addition to the emoluments of such Officer's substantive appointment.

(3) In other circumstances an Officer administering the Government shall be entitled to the full emoluments of the Governor if there is money available, but he shall only receive so much of such emoluments as is proportioned to the time he is in office.

8. The Governor or other Officer administering the Government shall, when in the Colony, receive a commuted allowance at the rate of nine hundred and sixty dollars per annum in lieu of exemptions from customs duties. Commuted customs duty allowance.

9. The Governor's Salary Ordinance, and the Governor's Salary (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927, are hereby repealed. Repeal. Cap. 3. Ord. 10-1927.

10. This Ordinance shall have retroactive effect and be deemed to have commenced on the 5th day of September, 1936. Commencement.
