AN ORDINANCE to amend the Agricultural Industry
Hurricane Relief Ordinance, 1933.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Agricultural Short title.
Industry Hurricane Relief (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938.

2. In the case of any owner to whom advances have Committee

been made before the commencement of this Ordinance
under the provisions of section 6 of the Agricultural
Industry Hurricane Relief Ordinance, 1933 (hereinafter
referred to as the Principal Ordinance) and of section 6A
added to the Principal Ordinance by section 3 of the
Agricultural Industry Hurricane Relief (Amendment)
Ordinance, 1934, it shall be lawful for the Committee to
increase the maximum amount of advances originally fixed
by the Committee: Provided that the total maximum
amount as increased shall not exceed one million and
fifty thousand dollars.

Such increase shall be granted by the Committee on
application made by the owner on or before the 31st
January, 1939, and the provisions of the Principal
Ordinance as amended by the Agricultural Industry
Hurricane Relief (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934 shall

have force and effect in respect of the application for and the grant of such increase as the aforesaid provisions had force and effect in respect of the original application for and the grant of advances.

Notification to Registrar-General of increased amount of advances.

3. The Chairman shall forward to the Registrar-General a written notification of the grant of any increase in the maximum amount of advances to an owner under the provisions of the next preceding section of this Ordinance, and the Registrar-General shall thereupon file such notification in the Register mentioned in section 12 of the Principal Ordinance and shall make an entry of such filing on the form already filed in the Register in respect of such owner: Provided that where the increase is in respect of land held under the provisions of the Real Property Ordinance, the Registrar-General shall also endorse a Memorandum of such increase upon the Crown Grant or Certificate of Title of such land.

Application of provisions of Principal Ordinance

4. Subject to the provisions of the foregoing sections 2 and 3 of this Ordinance, the Principal Ordinance, as amended by the Agricultural Industry Hurricane Relief (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, and the regulations made thereunder, shall apply in respect of the amount of the maximum advances as increased in pursuance of the provisions of this Ordinance, as if such amount as increased had been fixed originally and advances made accordingly.

Amendment of sections 12 and 16 of the Principal Ordinance.

5. Sections 12 and 16 of the Principal Ordinance shall be construed as if every reference therein to section 6 (2) of the Principal Ordinance included a reference to section 6A added to the Principal Ordinance by section 3 of the Agricultural Industry Hurricane Relief (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934.

Amendment of section 3 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1934

6. Section 3 of the Agricultural Industry Hurricane Relief (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, is amended by substituting in the 14th line thereof the word "seven" for the word "five" occurring between the words "end of" and the word "years."

Amendment of Regulations in 2nd Schedule to the Principal Ordinance.

7.—(1) Regulation 2 of the Agricultural Industry Hurricane Relief Regulations, 1933, as amended by Regulation 2 of the Agricultural Industry Hurricane Relief (Amendment) Regulation, 1934, is further amended by substituting therein "\$1,050,000" for "\$960,000" (£200,000).

(2) Regulations 9 and 10 of the Agricultural Industry Hurricane Relief Regulations, 1933, are amended by substituting the word "seven" for the word "five" wherever the word "five" occurs in the aforesaid regulations 9 and 10.
