AN ORDINANCE to enable the Governor in Executive Council to prohibit or restrict the exportation from the Colony of any living plant or any seed or fruit.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Plant (Export short title. Prohibition) Ordinance, 1938.

2. In this Ordinance the expression "plant" shall Interpretation. mean any living tree, shrub, root, herb, or grass, or any part thereof respectively, capable of being grown, or any seed or fruit.

3. The Governor in Executive Council may, by Exportation of proclamation published in the *Royal Gazette*, prohibit or plant may be restrict, subject to such conditions as may be set out in prohibited or the Proclamation, the exportation from the Colony of restricted by any plant or of any specified kind of plant named in such Proclamation. 4. Any plant the exportation of which is prohibited or restricted by proclamation issued under this Ordinance shall be deemed to be goods the exportation of which is prohibited or restricted within the meaning of the Customs Laws, as defined in section 3 of the Customs Ordinance.
