AN ORDINANCE to amend the Cinematograph (British
Films) Ordinance, 1932.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

Short title.
Construction.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cinematograph (British Films) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, shall be construed as one with the Cinematograph (British Films) Ordinance, 1932, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance, and shall come into operation on the day fixed for the commencement of the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment

2. Section 1 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following words "and shall apply only to such towns or other areas as may be specified by the Governor in Executive Council by Proclamation in the "*Royal Gazette*". A Proclamation made under this Section may be varied or revoked by Proclamation made in like manner".

3. Sub-section (2) of Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following sub-section substituted in lieu thereof :—

Repeal and

“(2) The proportion of British films so exhibited shall be ascertained in such manner as may be prescribed.”
