AN ORDINANCE relating to the currency of the Colony
and to substitute dollars and cents for pounds, shillings
and pence.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Currency Inter-
pretation Ordinance, 1934.

Substitution
of dollars and
cents for
pounds,
shillings and
pence.

2. Where in any law in force in the Colony at the com-
mencement of this Ordinance reference is made to pounds
shillings and pence such law shall have effect as if instead
reference had been made therein to an equivalent number
of dollars and cents at the rate of four dollars and eighty
cents for every pound, twenty-four cents for every shilling
and two cents for every penny.

Passed in Council this second day of November, in
the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and
thirty-four.
