AN ORDINANCE to amend the Estate and Succession Duties Ordinance, 1931.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Ordinance may be cited as the Estate and Succession Duties (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be construed as one with the Estate and Succession Duties Ordinance, 1931, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of s. 18 (3) of Principal Ordinance. **2.** Sub-section (3) of Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :—

18.—(3) The Governor in Executive Council may, by proclamation in the *Royal Gazette*, apply this section to any British possession, where he is satisfied that, by the law of such possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in this Colony when passing

on death, or that the law of such possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the provisions contained in sub-section (1) of this section.

3. The following paragraph shall be inserted in Schedule " A " of the Principal Ordinance, to follow paragraph (c) : Amendment of the Schedule.

(d) The provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Schedule shall apply only to estates of persons dying domiciled in the Colony.

Passed in Council this thirty-first day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.
