AN ORDINANCE to amend the Municipal Elections
Ordinance, Cap. 238.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipal
Elections (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be
read as one with the Municipal Elections Ordinance,
hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby
amended by the addition of the following sub-sections
to be numbered (9), (10) and (11) :—

Declaration of
willingness to
serve and of
qualifications.

(9) Every candidate for election shall at the time
of his nomination, hand to the Town Clerk
a declaration of his willingness to serve as a
Councillor, if elected, and shall also make a
declaration before the Town Clerk setting out

in detail his qualifications: Provided that, if the candidate is absent from the Colony at the time of his nomination such declaration may be signed and handed in to the Town Clerk by the duly constituted attorney or agent of such candidate.

- (10) Every such declaration shall be in such form as may be fixed by resolution of the Council from time to time.
- (11) Every person making any declaration under this section which he knows to be false in fact shall on summary conviction before a Magistrate be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Passed in Council this fifth day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.
