## AN ORDINANCE to amend the Customs Duties Ordinance, Cap. 195.

#### [27th February, 1932.]

**DE** it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago B with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :---

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1932, and shall be read and construction. construed as one with the Customs Duties Ordinance, Cap. 195, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, Repeal and and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :---

4.--(1) The value of any article, for the purpose Mode of of ascertaining the amount of the *ad valorem* duty ascertaining payable thereon, shall be the price which an duties. importer would give for the article if the article were delivered, freight and insurance paid, in bond at the

port of importation, and duty shall be paid on that value as fixed by the Collector of Customs and Excise.

(2) The value shall include the value of all packages, receptacles, coverings, wrappings, or other packing material, and all charges made in respect of packing and preparing the article for shipment.

(3) The importer shall at the request of the Collector of Customs and Excise produce the original invoices, and duplicates thereof if such duplicates are available, in respect of any goods imported into the Colony, and the Collector may retain such duplicates or such originals if no duplicates are available.

Repeal of s. 5 **3**. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed.

Amendment 4. The Second Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is of Schedule II hereby amended by the repeal of the words:

> "Packages or coverings in which any articles are imported, and which are, in the opinion of the Collector of Customs, the usual or proper packages or coverings"

in so far as they refer to goods liable to duty ad valorem.

Commencement. 5. This Ordinance shall commence on the 27th day of February, 1932.
