AN ORDINANCE to amend the Passports Ordinance,
Cap. 244.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Passports (Amend-
ment) Ordinance, 1933, shall be construed as one with the
Passports Ordinance, Cap. 244, hereinafter referred to as
the Principal Ordinance, and shall come into operation
on the date of publication in the *Royal Gazette*.
