REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 34 of 1989

[L.S.]

AN ACT to provide for the incorporation of the national cricket authority known as the Trinidad and Tobago Cricket Board of Control and for matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 15th August, 1989]

WHEREAS there has been established in the Republic of ^{Preamble} Trinidad and Tobago since 1980 a sporting organisation known as the Trinidad and Tobago Cricket Board of Control.

And whereas it is expedient that the said organisation should be incorporated for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

Enactment **BE IT ENACTED** by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:

Short Title **1.** This Act may be cited as the Trinidad and Tobago Cricket Board of Control (Incorporation) Act, 1989.

Incorporation **2.** The Trinidad and Tobago Cricket Board of Control (hereinafter called "the Cricket Board") is hereby created a body corporate.

Aims and objects **3.** The aims and objects of the Cricket Board are as follows:

- (a) to advance and improve cricket in Trinidad and Tobago by the organisation, promotion and control of first class and other cricket competitions;
- (b) to arrange, control and regulate inter-territorial and international tournaments promoted or sanctioned by the West Indies Cricket Board of Control directly or through appointed agents or representatives;
- (c) to promote, control, regulate and supervise all cricket in Trinidad and Tobago organised under the auspices of the Cricket Board; and
- (d) to perform all such other acts or things as may seem to the Cricket Board to be necessary or conducive to the welfare of cricket in Trinidad and Tobago in particular and the West Indies in general.

Powers of the Cricket Board

4. The Cricket Board shall have power—

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance, lease or howsoever otherwise real or personal property, or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts; and

- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title to sell, exchange, devise, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in it.

5. All real and personal property now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Cricket Board is hereby transferred to and vested in the Cricket Board.

Transfer and vesting of property

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Cricket Board shall be sealed with the common seal of the Cricket Board in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office or in the event of incapacity, by some other person authorised for that purpose by the Cricket Board who both shall sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Cricket Board.

Mode of execution of documents

7. (1) The Cricket Board shall at all times have a fixed address in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Cricket Board and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

Service of documents

(2) All documents to be served on the Cricket Board may be served by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the Cricket Board.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Cricket Board liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

8. The Cricket Board may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations.

Saving of State or
other rights

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State or any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
