## REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

## Act No. 42 of 1991

[L.S.]

An Act for the incorporation of the Faith Revival Ministries World Outreach and for matters incidental thereto

[Assented to 15th November, 1991]

Whereas there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago since 1982 an Organisation known as the Faith Revival Ministries World Outreach:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Organisation be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Faith Revival Ministries World Outreach (Incorporation) Act, 1991.

Incorporation

2. The Faith Revival Ministries World Outreach (hereinafter called "the Organisation") is hereby created a body corporate.

Aims and objects

- 3. The aims and objects of the Organisation are—
  - (a) to promote and disseminate the gospel of Jesus Christ through preaching, teaching and counselling, by radio, recordings, printed words and personal evangelism to the people of Trinidad and Tobago;
  - (b) to support similar works undertaken by individuals or other organisations in Trinidad and Tobago and elsewhere;
  - (c) to raise up and organise local congregations;
  - (d) to assemble together in worship for mutual edification and Christian fellowship in Jesus Christ and to organise and conduct meetings in the open air or in any other place that the Organisation may lawfully do so;
  - (e) to build, organise and operate institutes, schools and other places of learning and research in fields related to Christianity and the Christian person;
  - (f) to assist in the provision of libraries, reading rooms, bookshops, publishing houses, scholarship funds and lectures, for the advancement of education;
  - (g) to publish Christian books, magazines, leaflets, brochures and such other literature or other media material as may be considered necessary from time to time;

- (Incorporation)
  - (h) to support poor and needy students, scholars or such other persons whose services may be considered conducive to the attainment of the object of the Organisation, in the form of grants, loans, salaries and scholarships;
  - (i) to foster, feed, clothe or otherwise care and provide for poor, underprivileged and destitute persons;
  - (j) to build, organise and operate facilities for housing and caring for poor, underprivileged and destitute persons;
  - (k) to provide, free of charge, technical assistance and services as may be needed by others pursuing similar objects;
  - (1) to receive, request and collect monies, subscriptions or donations by way of gift or otherwise for carrying out the work of the Organisation;
  - (m) to do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

## 4. The Organisation shall have power to—

Powers of the organisation

- (a) acquire by purchase, transfer, donation. devise, bequest, exchange, grant, conveyance, lease or howsoever otherwise any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) sell, exchange, demise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in it, subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title.

Transfer or vesting of property

5. All real or personal property of whatever nature now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Organisation is hereby transferred to and vested in the Organisation.

Mode of execution of documents

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Organisation, shall be sealed with the common seal of the Organisation in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office, or, in the event of incapacity, in the presence of some other person or persons authorised for that purpose by the Organisation who both shall sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Organisation.

Service of documents

- 7. (1) The Organisation shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on it and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.
- (2) Every document to be served on the Organisation may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the registered address of the Organisation.
- (3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Organisation liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

Power to make rules

8. The Organisation may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations.

Saving of State and other rights 9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other person, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
