Act No. 19 of 1984

AN ACT to provide for the incorporation of Calvary
Sovereign Grace Baptist Church.

[Assented to 28th June, 1984]

WHEREAS there exist a religious non-profitable and charitable institution in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago with offices at No. 2 Nelson Street, Arima, known as Calvary Sovereign Grace Baptist Church. Preamble

And whereas it is expedient that Calvary Sovereign Grace Baptist Church should be incorporated:

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as Calvary Sovereign Grace Baptist Church (Incorporation) Act, 1984.

Incorporation

2. Calvary Sovereign Grace Baptist Church in this Act called "the Church" is hereby created a body corporate.

Aims and objects

3. The aims and objects of the Church are as follows:

- (a) to preach the everlasting gospel of Our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ;
- (b) to build churches, schools, orphanages and homes for the aged;
- (c) to provide on a non-profitable basis institutions for nursing and caring the sick and elderly.

Powers of the Church

4. The Powers of the Church are as follows:

- (a) to make rules for the purpose of carrying out the aims and objectives of the Church;
- (b) to acquire by purchase, exchange, gift, bequest, devise or otherwise, real and personal property or any estate or interest therein and also any money, goods, securities for money, chattels whatsoever;
- (c) to sell, demise, grant, convey, transfer, mortgage, recover, surrender, exchange or otherwise dispose of all or any property, real or personal, from time to time vested in it.

Mode of execution of documents

5. All deeds, documents and other instruments requiring the seal of the Church shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of the pastor and the Clerk for the time being, who will sign every deed or

other instrument to which the common seal is affixed and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the seal was duly and properly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Church.

6. (1) The Church shall at all times have a fixed address in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on it, and the address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Church shall be served by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the Church.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and on conviction the Church is liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

7. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State of Trinidad and Tobago, or of any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
