AN ACT for the Incorporation of The Rotary Club of
Port-of-Spain West and for matters incidental
thereto.

[Assented to 5th September, 1997]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and ^{Preamble}
Tobago an organisation known as The Rotary Club of
Port-of-Spain West:

And whereas it is expedient that the said be
incorporated for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

- Enactment** ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—
- Short title** 1. This Act may be cited as The Rotary Club of Port-of-Spain West (Incorporation) Act, 1997.
- Incorporation** 2. The Rotary Club of Port-of-Spain West (in this Act referred to as “the Club”) is hereby created a body corporate.
- Aims and objects** 3. The aims and objects of the Club are:
- (a) to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis for worthy enterprise;
 - (b) to encourage and foster the development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
 - (c) to foster the development of high ethical standards in business and professions;
 - (d) to promote and encourage the recognition of all useful occupations and the dignifying of the occupation of each Rotarian as an opportunity to serve society;
 - (e) to encourage and foster the application of the ideal of service in the personal, business, and community life of each Rotarian;
 - (f) to promote the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service; and
 - (g) to do all such other things as are necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above aims and objects.

4. The Club shall have power:

Power of the club

- (a) to acquire by way of gift, donation, devise, bequest, purchase, exchange, demise, assignment, conveyance, or howsoever otherwise any right, title, estate or interest in any real or personal property;
- (b) to accept surrenders, reconveyances and reassignments and to enter into contracts;
- (c) to sell, exchange, demise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all or any right, title, state or interest in any real or personal property which may for the time being be vested in it subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title;
- (d) to execute all deeds, instruments and documents and do all acts, deeds, matters and things which shall be necessary or proper for or in connection with the vesting in it by way of gift, donation, devise or bequest, or in respect of the sale, purchase, exchange, demise, assignment, surrender or release of any right, title, estate or interest in any real or personal property which are or which may from time to time be vested in it.

5. All right, title, estate or interest in any real and personal property now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Club is hereby transferred to and vested in the Club.

Transfer and vesting
of property

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Club shall be sealed with the common seal of the club in the presence of the President or President-Elect, or if neither is available, a member of the Board of Directors nominated by the Board for the purpose, and of the Secretary or any person acting in such capacity who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Club.

Mode of execution of
documents

Service of documents

7. (1) The Club shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Club and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight (28) days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Club may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the registered address of the Club.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Club liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefore.

Power to make rules

8. The Club may from time to time make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions and may amend such rules.

Saving of State and other rights

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
