TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 28 of 1966

[L.S.]

AN ACT to provide for the Incorporation of certain persons as Trustees of the Port-of-Spain Chapter (AMORC) in Trinidad and Tobago.

[Assented to 13th September, 1966]

WHEREAS Wendel V. L. Wiltshire, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Port-of-Spain Chapter of (AMORC) in Trinidad, Otilia Peyson, Secretary of the Board of Trustees and Mervyn Archibald Gibbs, Treasurer of the Board of Trustees of the said Chapter are desirous of being formed into a corporate body.

And whereas the said Port-of-Spain Chapter exists by virtue of a charter issued by the Grand Lodge of AMORC under authority of the Supreme Grand Lodge of AMORC and whereas it is expedient that the said Wendel V. L. Wiltshire, Otilia Peyson and Mervyn Archibald Gibbs should be incorporated.

Enactment BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same as follows :—

Short title 1. This Act may be cited as the Port-of-Spain Chapter (AMORC) Incorporation Act, 1966.

Incorporation of Trustees 2. Wendel V. L. Wiltshire and his successors in Office as Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Port-of-Spain Chapter (AMORC) in Trinidad, Otilia Peyson, Member of the said Board of Trustees and Mervyn Archibald Gibbs Member of the said Board of Trustees, and their successors in office as Chairman and Member of the Board of Trustees of the said Chapter respectively, shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Port-of-Spain Chapter (AMORC)" in Trinidad and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in Trinidad and Tobago and shall have and use a common Seal which may from time to time be changed. Provided that no such change shall be made except by resolution of the members in open convocation assembled.

Trustees may acquire property 3. The corporate body hereby created shall have full power to acquire by purchase, transfer and donations or otherwise any real and personal property in Trinidad and Tobago or any estate or interest therein.

The Trustees may dispose of property 4. The said corporate body shall, subject to any restraint reservation or condition contained in the document under which it shall have acquired titles thereto be

entitled to sell, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by it.

5. (1) The said corporate body shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents and such address and changes thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General.

Registration and address for service of documents and manner of service

(2) Any document may be served on the said corporate body by leaving the same at, or sending the same by registered post to, the address registered under subsection (1).

6. All deeds, documents and other instruments requiring the seal of the said corporate body shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of two of the Incorporated Trustees who shall sign every such deed, document or other instrument to which the common seal is affixed.”;

Mode of execution of documents

7. Nothing in this Act shall affect and be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming through, from or under them.

Saving of Crown and other rights
