AN ORDINANCE to make provision for the grant of a gratuity on a special basis to the legal personal representative of Milton Wainwright Gilkes, deceased, former Principal Officer in the Education Department of the Colony.

Commencement

[4th May, 1955.]

Enactment

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Gilkes (Special Gratuity) Ordinance, 1955.*

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any law relating to the grant of pensions, there may be paid from general revenue to the legal personal representative of Milton Wainwright Gilkes, former Principal Officer in the Education Department of the Colony, in respect of the service of the said officer in a civil capacity under the Government of the Colony, a gratuity of one thousand five hundred and eight dollars and four cents being the difference between the sum of six thousand four hundred and thirteen dollars and four cents and the total of all sums paid from general revenue to the said officer by way of gratuity and reduced pension in respect of his said service.

Authority to pay gratuity of \$1,508.04 to the legal personal representative of Milton Wainwright Gilkes, deceased

3. The gratuity payable under and by virtue of this Ordinance shall be in lieu of any pension or of any pension and gratuity for which, but for the provisions of this Ordinance, the said Milton Wainwright Gilkes might at the date of his death have been eligible in respect of his service in a civil capacity under the Government of the Colony, and no further payment of pension or gratuity shall be made to the said legal personal representative of the said Milton Wainwright Gilkes in respect of such service.

Gratuity under this Ordinance to be in lieu of any other claims to pension or gratuity

Passed in Council this eleventh day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five.
