THE AID TO PIONEER INDUSTRIES ORDINANCE, CH. 33. No. 3

ORDER

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE
AID TO PIONEER INDUSTRIES ORDINANCETHE AID TO PIONEER INDUSTRIES (KENT-LEEDS (TRINIDAD)
LIMITED) (MANUFACTURE AND ASSEMBLY OF METERS
FOR THE MEASUREMENT OF LIQUIDS) ORDER, 1966

1. This Order may be cited as the Aid to Pioneer Industries (Kent-Leeds (Trinidad) Limited) (Manufacture and Assembly of Meters for the Measurement of Liquids) Order, 1966.

2. Kent-Leeds (Trinidad) Limited, a company registered under the Companies Ordinance, Ch. 31. No. 1 (hereinafter referred to as the "pioneer company") is hereby declared to be a pioneer manufacturer for the purposes of the Aid to Pioneer Industries Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance") in relation to—

- (a) its pioneer factory located at Numbers 44-46 South Quay, Port-of-Spain, and
- (b) the manufacture and assembly of meters for the measurement of liquids by the Aid to Pioneer Industries (Manufacture and Assembly of Meters for the Measurement of Liquids) Order, 1964, declared to be a pioneer industry,

with effect from the 30th day of November, 1966 and the production day of the said factory is hereby declared to be the 3rd April, 1967.

3. This Order is subject to the following continuing conditions :—

- (a) that the pioneer company shall keep its pioneer factory equipped with the following minimum items of equipment—
 - (i) Three (3) Capstan Lathes
 - (ii) One (1) Capstan Pillar Drill; and
 - (iii) A complement of equipment comprising:
 - Milling equipment;
 - Jigs;
 - Gauges; and
 - Testing Apparatus
- (b) that the pioneer company shall maintain accounts in respect of the pioneer enterprise to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Income Tax;
- (c) that the pioneer company shall—
 - (i) observe the practice and policy generally accepted in Trinidad and Tobago with respect to labour relations and conditions of employment;

- (ii) as far as practicable recruit its employees through the Ministry of Labour;
- (d) that, notwithstanding the exemption from income tax under section 8 of the Ordinance, the pioneer company shall submit annually a return of the income so exempt from tax at the same time and in the same manner as it would be required to do if the income were not exempt from tax.

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES PAYABLE TO MEMBERS OF THE
DEFENCE FORCE TO AND FROM THEIR RESIDENCE AND
THEIR PLACE OF DUTY

It is hereby notified that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by regulation 15 of the Defence (Rates of Pay and Allowances) Regulations, 1962, as amended by the Defence (Rates of Pay and Allowances) (Amendment) Regulations, 1963, the Governor-General has with effect from the 1st day of January, 1966, fixed the following rates for travelling allowances and the conditions under which such rates are payable to members of the Defence Force who travel daily to and from their residences and place of duty:—

Quali-
fication for
travelling
allowance

1. (1) A member of the Defence Force qualifies for the payment of travelling allowance in accordance with the rates set out in paragraph 2 or 3, as the case may require, if—

- (a) he is required to reside three or more miles from his place of duty; or
 - (b) he is not provided with living accommodation and resides three or more miles from his place of duty; and
 - (c) he uses his private motor car or public transport for travelling between his residence and his place of duty.
- (2) In calculating the distance at which a member of the Defence Force resides from his place of duty—
- (a) the entrance to the United States Naval Operating Base at Chaguaramas shall be taken to be the commencing point of any such distance;
 - (b) no account shall be taken of any mileage claimed by a member of the Force which exceeds the distance to and from his residence and place of duty which is normally claimed by him as being the shortest direct route between those points.

Public transport

2. (1) In this paragraph and in paragraph 1, "public transport" means a motor omnibus, train, or a taxi maintained for the use of the public, but does not include a taxi hired for the sole use of a member of the Force.

(2) A member of the Defence Force who uses public transport for travelling between his place of residence and his duty station is entitled to be refunded the actual fare which he pays for such transport.

Private cars

3. A member of the Defence Force who uses his private car for travelling between his place of residence and his place of duty is entitled to three and one half cents for each mile so travelled.

Effective date of travelling allowances

4. The rates of travelling allowances specified in paragraphs 2 and 3 and the conditions under which such allowances are payable specified in paragraph 1, have effect from the 1st day of January, 1966.
