REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

THE DEFENCE ACT, CHAP. 14:01

REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE AND NATIONAL SECURITY  
UNDER SECTION 244 OF THE DEFENCE ACT

THE DEFENCE (RATES OF PAY AND ALLOWANCES)  
REGULATIONS, 1989

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Rates of Pay and Allowances) Regulations, 1989. Citation

2. (1) In these Regulations—

Interpre-  
tation

“child” in relation to a member of the Force includes the offsprings, stepchild or adopted child who has not attained the age of sixteen years;

“military qualifications” means any qualification of a military nature that is laid down in orders of a Commanding Officer;

“reckonable service” means continuous paid colour service in the Force after attaining the age of eighteen years;

“tradesman” means an other rank who is employed in any trade that is laid down in orders of a Commanding Officer.

(2) A reference to a group or a class of tradesmen is to be construed as a reference to a group or class laid down in orders of a Commanding Officer.

3. The rates of pay for officers and other ranks are as set out in Part I of the Schedule. Rates of pay

4. A member of the Force who holds an acting rank, is entitled to receive the same pay at the minimum rate or at the appropriate point in the scale, and allowances, as prescribed for the holder of the substantive rank. Pay and allowances of acting rank

5. (1) A rent-free official residence shall be provided for the Chief of Defence Staff, the Commanding Officer of the Trinidad and Tobago Regiment, and the Commanding Officer of the Trinidad and Tobago Coast Guard. Rent-free accommodation

(2) This provision is deemed to have come into effect from 1st September, 1971.

6. (1) An unaccommodated rent allowance at the rates set out in Part II of the Schedule shall be paid to a member of the Force who is married. Rent allowance

(2) An officer is entitled to an unaccommodated rent allowance where he—

(a) is maintaining his wife and his dependent children; and

(b) is not accommodated in quarters provided by the State for married officers.

(3) An other rank is entitled to an unaccommodated rent allowance where he—

- (a) is maintaining his wife and dependent children; and
- (b) is not accommodated in quarters provided by the State for married officers.

(4) An officer or an other rank who is in receipt of such an allowance shall notify his Commanding Officer forthwith of any change in the circumstances of his family which affects his entitlement to the allowance.

Officer or other rank entitled to disturbance allowance

7. (1) An officer or other rank who is married is, subject to subregulation (2), entitled to a disturbance allowance where—

- (a) he has to move his family as a result of a change in his place of duty which is expected to be for a period of—
  - (i) six months or more where he remains in Trinidad and Tobago; or
  - (ii) eight months or more where he leaves Trinidad and Tobago; or
- (b) he is required for service reasons to reside in or to surrender quarters which he occupies.

(2) No officer or other rank is entitled to a disturbance allowance—

- (a) on first setting up a home in a private residence or in a government quarters or on hiring at his first place of duty on joining the Force;
- (b) on marrying;
- (c) on changes made by his arrangement or for disciplinary reasons; or
- (d) on retirement or on discharge from the force.

(3) A disturbance allowance is payable at the rates set out in Part II of the Schedule.

(4) For the purposes of this regulation “a change of place of duty” is deemed to take place if the new place of duty of the officer or the other rank is at such a distance from or in such a location in relation to the place where his family resides that he cannot, in the opinion of his Commanding Officer, be reasonably expected to travel daily to and from that place and his new place of duty.

Ration allowance

8. (1) Subject to paragraph (3) a member of the Force is entitled to a ration allowance for each day on which the member does not receive rations.

(2) The ration allowance is payable at the rate set out in Part II of the Schedule.

(3) A ration allowance is not payable to any member of the Force who is in receipt of any other allowance in respect of meals.

Commuted travel allowance

9. (1) The Comptroller of Accounts may grant loans in respect of the purchase of a standard grade motor vehicle and the purchase of motor vehicle insurance, to the—

- (a) Chief of Defence Staff;
- (b) Commanding Officer of the Regiment;
- (c) Commanding Officer of the Coast Guard.

(2) The terms of any loan granted under this regulation, shall be similar to those granted to officers whose posts are scheduled under the Travelling Regulations.

(3) The officers referred to at subregulation (1), are entitled to a commuted travelling allowance at the same rates as are applicable to officers in the Public Service.

10. A member of the Force who, when official transport is not available, uses his vehicle in the course of his duty, is entitled to a motor mileage allowance at the same rates as are applicable to officers in the Public Service whose posts are scheduled under the Travelling Regulations. Mileage allowance

11. A member of the Force who, in the course of his duty, is required to travel daily from his residence to his place of duty and vice versa is entitled to a travel allowance at the rate set out in Part II of the Schedule. Home to duty travel allowance

12. (1) A member of the Force, who is proceeding on duty from one place of duty to another, is entitled to receive transportation from the Force to and from that place of duty free of cost. Transportation allowance

(2) The spouse and every child of a member of the Force to whom paragraph (1) applies, is entitled to receive from the Force—

(a) transportation to that member's other place of duty free of cost if the tour of duty is expected to extend beyond six months and is to be served outside of Trinidad and Tobago;

(b) the cost of transportation to the member's other place of duty if his tour of duty in that other place is expected to extend beyond eight months and the tour of duty is outside of Trinidad and Tobago.

13. (1) A member of the Force who is proceeding on leave within Trinidad and Tobago is entitled to receive transportation from the Force from his normal place of duty to and from the place where the leave is to be spent. Transportation leave allowance

(2) The spouse and every child of a member of the Force to whom paragraph (1) applies is entitled to receive transportation from the Force, from the place where they normally reside to and from the place where the leave is to be spent.

14. (1) Where an officer or an other rank is on duty, other than on operations or training, away from his place of duty, he is entitled to a daily subsistence allowance as set out in Part II of the Schedule. Subsistence allowance

(2) Where an officer or other rank is on duty, other than an operations or training, away from his place of duty, he shall be refunded the expenses incurred for accommodation, overnight or otherwise, including expenses for meals, on producing to his Commanding Officer receipts for expenses.

(3) In addition to the amount which may be refunded under paragraph (2) an officer or other rank is entitled to out-of-pocket expenses per night at the rates set out in Part II of the Schedule.

(4) Where an officer or other rank is on duty in a country other than Trinidad and Tobago including being on training in such a country, in addition to all expenses for accommodation and meals being defrayed, he is entitled to a daily subsistence allowance as set out in Part II of the Schedule.

**Uniform allowance**

15. A member of the Force is entitled, on his first appointment to a commission in the Force, to a uniform allowance and subsequently, a uniform upkeep allowance payable in January of each year, at the rates set out in Part II of the Schedule.

**Pay and allowance for overseas duty**

16. (1) A member of the Force who is in a country other than Trinidad and Tobago, for the purpose of being attached to, serving with or attending a course with Forces of that other country, is entitled to the rate of pay he receives in his rank and according to his service in Trinidad and Tobago, and to his other allowances unless these other allowances are being paid directly to the relevant authority in that other country by the Government of Trinidad and Tobago.

(2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), a member of the Force is entitled to the cost of transportation to and from the school or unit where he is attached, serving or attending a course, in accordance with the rules of the establishment to which he is attached or with which he is serving.

(3) Where a member of the Force is of the opinion that hardship is being experienced in obtaining accommodation and rations because of the existing rates, the member may apply to the Minister for a variation of the rates, and the Minister may vary the rates, after due consideration of the application.

**Warm clothing allowance**

17. (1) An officer, other rank, or a cadet, who is selected to attend an overseas course, is entitled to a warm clothing allowance at the same rates as are payable to Government scholars, or trainees or training awards, in the Northern Hemisphere where the training includes the whole or part of the period 1st October to 31st May or the corresponding period in the Southern Hemisphere.

(2) This provision takes effect from the 1st January, 1975.

(3) Where an officer, other rank or a cadet to whom paragraph (1) applies, is required to wear the uniform of the country in which he is attending the course, the host country may supply the uniform and the cost shall be borne by the Government of Trinidad and Tobago.

**Free passage allowance**

18. (1) A member of the Force who is recruited from outside of Trinidad and Tobago is entitled, on the expiration of every three years and subject to subregulation (2) to travel free of cost from his place of duty to and from the country from which he was recruited, when proceeding on leave to that country.

(2) The entitlement mentioned in subregulation (1) also applies to four of the member's immediate family but ceases if the member becomes a citizen of Trinidad and Tobago or is domiciled in the country from which he is recruited.

**Pay of artificer**

19. An other rank who performs the duties of an artificer in the Coast Guard or similar duties in the Regiment is entitled to be paid as an artificer at the rates set out in Part II of the Schedule.

**Hard-lying pay**

20. (1) A member of the Force is entitled to a hard-lying allowance at the rate set out in Part II of the Schedule for each completed period of twenty-four hours spent aboard a Coast Guard vessel or in any other hazardous operational exercises in the field.

(2) The period referred to in subregulation (1) must be a continuous period.

21. A member of the Force is entitled to special service pay at the rate set out in Part II of the Schedule for any day during which he is performing any of the following duties—

- (a) commanding vessels belonging to the Coast Guard, in the case of ratings;
- (b) diving; or
- (c) such other duties of a very responsible or dangerous nature as may be approved by the Minister.

22. An other rank, signing on for the maximum permissible period of service after completing initial periods of service of six and twelve years, is entitled to a re-engagement bounty at the rate set out in Part II of the Schedule.

23. The Chief of Defence Staff and the Commanding Officers of the Regiment and the Coast Guard are entitled to an entertainment allowance at the rate set out in Part II of the Schedule.

24. The Chaplaincy Fees are as follows—

- (a) a capitation fee as set out in Part II of the Schedule; and
- (b) a commuted travelling allowance at the rate set out in Part II of the Schedule.

25. An officer who proceeds to a foreign country to attend conferences or meetings or as an adviser to an official delegation is, in addition to the pay and allowances to which he is entitled under these Regulations, entitled to the subsistence allowance set out in Part II of the Schedule.

26. Each member of a team representing the Defence Force at a sporting event abroad is entitled to hotel accommodation and meals, where these are not provided by the host country to the pay and allowances to which he is entitled under these Regulations, and to a further subsistence allowance at the rate set out in Part II of the Schedule.

27. (1) An acting appointment is to be made only where there is a vacancy and the acting allowances payable are as follows—

- (a) where the acting is in a vacancy, the minimum salary of the higher rank in which the person is acting shall be paid;
- (b) where the acting appointment is of a temporary nature—
  - (i) if the officer is fully qualified to act in the higher rank, because of service and academic qualifications, the minimum salary of the higher rank in which the officer is acting, shall be paid;
  - (ii) if the officer is partly qualified to act in the higher rank, either because of service or academic qualifications, seventy-five per cent of the difference between the minimum salary of the higher rank in which he is acting, and the officer's substantive salary shall be paid; or
  - (iii) if the officer has neither the academic nor the service qualifications, fifty-per cent of the difference between the minimum salary of the higher rank in which he is acting and the officer's substantive salary shall be paid.

(2) An acting allowance shall be paid for acting in the ranks of Warrant Officer II and above, in the Regiment and Chief Petty Officer and above, in the Coast Guard.

(3) This provision comes into force from 1st January, 1975.

Paid service in Her Majesty's Forces may be taken into account to determine rates of pay

28. Where the rates of pay to which a member of the Force is entitled under these Regulations is to be computed on the basis of his length of service in the Force, either in a particular rank or generally, any paid service in Her Majesty's military forces, which immediately preceded service in the Force shall be taken into account for the purposes of such computation, to the same extent as it would have been taken into account if it were service in the Force.

Allowances to be promulgated

29. The entitlement of officers and other ranks to the allowances specified in these Regulations as well as the rate of these allowances shall be promulgated in Orders of the Defence Force.

Force and effect

30. Unless otherwise expressly stated in these Regulations, these Regulations are deemed to have come into force from 1st January, 1974.

Revocation of Regulations

31. The Defence (Rates of Pay and Allowances) Regulations, 1962, are revoked.
