A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS section 238(1) of the Defence Act, Chap. 14:01 provides *inter alia*, that the President may call out the Volunteer Defence Force or any portion of it for actual military service with their arms and ammunition, in aid of the civil power in any case in which a riot, disturbance of the peace or other emergency requiring such service occurs or is, in the opinion of the President, anticipated as likely to occur, and in either case to be beyond the powers of the civil authorities to suppress or to prevent or deal with:

And whereas the State deems it necessary to call out to duty, members of the Volunteer Defence Force for a period of eighty-one days with effect from 21st May, 2004 to 9th August, 2004 to assist the regular Force in anti-crime operations being conducted in Tobago:

Now, therefore, I, GEORGE MAXWELL RICHARDS, President as aforesaid, hereby call out for a period of eighty-one days with effect from 21st May, 2004 to 9th August, 2004, a complement of thirty-six members of the Trinidad and Tobago Volunteer Defence Force for actual military service with their arms and ammunition, in aid of the civil power in the maintenance of peace and public order in Tobago.
